METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 600 likely Republican primary runoff election voters in Alabama and the margin of error is +/-4.0%. Responses were gathered via landline interviews conducted with Interactive Voice Response (IVR) technology. The survey was conducted August 24 - 26, 2017 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
