METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 689 likely voters and the margin of error is +/- 3.73 %. The Interactive Voice Response (IVR) automated telephone survey was conducted March 8-9, 2014 by Harper Polling on behalf of American Action Network. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
